We suggest printing a copy of the campus map so that you can more easily enjoy your self-guided tour of our plants and gardens (you will probably be asked to park in lot B). Our campus is a national historic landmark, and we hope you enjoy our statuary and historic building exteriors during your visit. To ensure the safety and security of you and our students, guests are not permitted in any of the university buildings (except the library). The campus as a whole is handicapped accessible, but the sunken garden is not, and most paths through the formal, Italian and Japanese gardens are pebble-covered and narrow. A 2005 edition color history and guidebook with a map explaining the self-guided tour is available for free from either the guardhouse at the university entrance, or the library (when the library is open). The self-guided tour begins in front of Farley Center. It is sometimes possible to arrange a group tour.
